

Is It?**



Continuous provision provides a consistent, well-organised learning environment with accessible, stimulating resources that children can use independently to follow their own interests and engage in child-initiated play.

What will this mean for my child?

The implementation of Continuous Provision to KS1, is being led by Miss Clark who is an experienced EYFS and Year 1 teacher, having implemented and taught Continuous Provision for many years.

- Sycamore Class have launched Continuous Provision in their classroom.
- Larch and Cedar Classes have launched Enhanced Provision which complements the work already done in the classroom, and provides the children with the same opportunities for child-initiated play.

The aim is to roll Continuous Provision into Larch Class in the next academic year....




SLOW AND STEADY

- Practise spelling Sticky Words at home. We will share an overview of what Sticky Words we will be learning each week on the class pages of the website.


- Login to Times Table Rockstars.
